Description:	<p>Wamberal Public School's Swimming Carnival will be held on Wednesday 19 February 2025 at Gosford Olympic Pool Centre. Students from Year 2 to 6 are expected to attend.</p> <p>As the carnival is run as 'heats only' and overall winners are determined on times, it is essential that students who are competent swimmers nominate and have their names recorded for their selected races.</p> <p>Please check all entry forms to ensure all information is correct, especially your child's date of birth and correct entry age. Incorrect information could result in your child being entered into the wrong event.</p> <p>To alleviate the congestion of events at the swimming carnival, we will be conducting the 100 metres freestyle, 200 metres individual medleys and butterfly events earlier in the morning. If your child is competing in these events, please have your child at the pool 8:30am for an 8:45 am start (100 metres will be first). These students will return to school on the bus and are required to pay the full fare through the school.</p>

Dress Code:	<p>Suitable swim wear, enclosed shoes for bus transport.</p> <p>Students can wear sports colours, however no body paint or crepe paper is allowed to be used at the centre. Students with body paint will be refused entry to the facility. The use of clear zinc only is permitted, no coloured zinc allowed.</p>
Food:	Students are to bring their own water bottle. Students are to bring their own recess and lunch.
Additional Information:	Please advise if your child/ren will be picked up by another person at the conclusion. Please provide the full name and contact details of this person and their relationship to your child. *Note* this person will be required to provide ID.

Privacy Note: The information provided below is being obtained for the purpose of ascertaining relevant medical information, requirements and other health care related needs about the student who is currently enrolled at the school and who may participate in school excursions, sporting activities or other educational or school activities conducted by or in conjunction with Wamberal Public School.

It will be used by officers of the NSW Department of Education to assist planning, to support students, and to minimise risks when conducting school excursions, sporting or other school activities.

Other persons or agencies that may be provided with this information include, but are not limited to, volunteers and members of external organisations who join with the school or are otherwise involved in the planning or delivery of the excursion, sporting or other school activity; and persons that may be called upon to provide health care treatment or other assistance during or as a consequence of such excursions or activities.

Provision of this information is not required by law. However, a failure to provide the information may mean that your child can not participate in a particular excursion or school activity. In such circumstances the school will make available a sound alternative educational experience.

Provision of this information will significantly assist the school in planning a safer educational activity. It will be stored securely. If you have any concerns about provision of this information, please contact the school principal to discuss further.

You may correct any personal information provided at any time by contacting the school office.

Health Care Needs

When a medical practitioner has prescribed medication (including emergency medication) that will need to be administered during the event, parents are responsible for:

- bringing this need to the attention of the school, including completing a written request to administer medication (forms are available on the school website);
- ensuring that the information is updated if it changes;
- supplying the medication and any 'consumables' necessary for its administration in a timely way;
- ensuring the medication is well within its expiry date; and

- collaborating with the school in working out arrangement for the supply and administration of the prescribed medication for the duration of the event.

For some events, the school will ask parents to supply the medication in a different way to what has already been agreed by the school. For example, parents may be asked to supply an additional adrenaline autoinjector (i.e. *EpiPen®* /*Anapen®*).

For asthma and anaphylaxis it is important for students to have immediate access to their medication. Please consider whether your child should carry their own EpiPen®, Anapen® or asthma reliever medication while at school. Permissions for students to carry their own asthma or anaphylaxis medication can be downloaded from the school website.

Important information

In the event of injury, no personal injury insurance cover is provided by the NSW Department of Education for students in relation to school sporting activities, physical education lessons or any other school activity. The Department's public liability cover is fault-based and limited to breaches by the Department of its duty of care to students that may result in claims for compensation.

Parents/Carers are advised to assess the level and extent of their child's involvement in the sport program offered by the school, school sport zone, region and state school sport Associations when deciding whether additional insurance cover is required prior to their child's involvement in the program. Personal accident insurance cover is available through normal retail outlets.

Parents/Carers who have private ambulance cover need to check whether that cover extends to interstate travel and make additional arrangements, as considered appropriate.

The NSW Supplementary Sporting Injury Benefits Scheme, funded by the NSW Government, provides limited cover for serious injury resulting in the permanent loss of a prescribed faculty or the loss of use of certain prescribed parts of the body. The Supplementary Scheme does not cover medical costs or dental costs. Accident insurance information

In the event of injury, no accident or medical insurance cover is provided by the NSW Government Treasury Managed Fund for students participating in school sporting activities, physical education lessons or any other school endorsed activity, unless there is a breach of duty of care by department or school staff. The NSW Department of Education is insured to meet the financial impact of any legal liabilities arising from its activities. It does not provide, nor has it ever provided, accident or medical insurance for students enrolled in government schools.

Concussion management

When a student enrolled in a government school is diagnosed with concussion, the principal must be advised in writing as soon as the diagnosis is confirmed. Students may only return to sport and physical activity once a medical clearance has been provided to the school and, if at a school sport event, to the supervising teacher.

Any student that experiences a suspected concussion during a school endorsed activity, will be removed from the activity and parents/carers will be advised that a medical follow-up is required.

If medical clearance is not provided, the student cannot participate in vigorous or competitive school sport or physical activities for 21 days from the concussion date.
